ing has the support of the president, and high administration officials have no doubt that he will back up Mitchell in the DeGroot incident.

**Oregon Case Precedent**  
The attorney general himself has no authority to remove a district attorney, but the supreme court, in the celebrated Oregon postmaster case, decided that President Wilson's expedient of appointing a successor was legal and that the chief executive had authority to displace appointive officials from the government service.

Mitchell has already requested and received the resignations of three other district attorneys and is expected to ask for others. Those who have complied with his request were stationed at Jackson, Ore. and in Mississippi, and their successors are expected to be named in the near future.
