

FULLERTON SCHOOL STUDENTS WIN IN HEALTH CONTEST

Fifth and Sixth Grade Room Is Highest in City From the Standpoint of Corrections.

Awards to Be Presented Next Friday; Motion Pictures to Be Made of Winners.

The "blue ribbon" or honor roll contest which has been conducted among the schools of Roseburg and among the larger schools of Douglas county outside of Roseburg closed Monday, April 22. The results of the final count were very gratifying to the Douglas County Health Unit, which conducted the contest and the teachers who have been unflinching in their efforts to get as many corrections made in the school children as possible.

The fifth and sixth grade room of Fullerton school was the banner room and did remarkably well. There are twenty-four pupils enrolled in this room, all of which had a physical examination and a dental examination, and twenty pupils of that twenty-four have qualified as "blue ribbon" pupils. There were seventeen corrections made, most of which were dental, to secure this number of honor roll pupils. One hundred per cent of the pupils in Fullerton school were examined by Roseburg doctors and they have the honor of having the highest percentage of blue ribbon pupils. There are ninety-three pupils enrolled and examined and a total of sixty-four "blue ribbon" pupils, giving them a percentage of 68.8%.

The banner room of Benson school was Miss Sherka's room which had twenty-eight pupils enrolled all but one of which had physical examinations. There were nineteen "blue ribbon" pupils in this room. Benson school has two hundred five pupils enrolled, and only nine of these failed to get physical examinations. One hundred twelve pupils qualified as "blue ribbon" pupils, giving Benson a percentage of 54.5%.

Miss Caruther's room won the banner in Rose school, having twenty-three "blue ribbon" pupils from an enrollment of thirty-two, twenty-eight of which were examined. Miss Fredrickson's room was a very close second, having had the lead for some time. Rose school has two hundred sixty pupils enrolled, thirty-two having failed to avail themselves of the opportunity to receive this physical examination by Roseburg doctors. One hundred forty of those examined qualified for the "blue ribbon," giving that school a percentage of 52.84%.
