

SOUTHERN PACIFIC BIRTHDAY PARTY TO BE HELD MAY 10

SAN FRANCISCO, May 2.—Southern Pacific is going to wish itself many happy returns of its sixtieth birthday May 10 and is inviting the entire Pacific slope to join in the celebration. In addition to putting on the counter a travel bargain—a round trip between any two points on Pacific lines for 50 per cent of the one way fare—there is going to be a birthday party that night.

Because its family is so big—nearly 60,000 in the west and southwest—the birthday will be up in the air—broadcast by radio from station KPO., San Francisco, over the Pacific coast network of the Pacific Broadcasting company, and Salt Lake, Utah.

Reginald Werrenrath, famous baritone, will help make the party a success, coming all the way from New York just to do so.

On May 10, 1929, at Promontory, Utah, the Central Pacific—first unit of the Southern Pacific—building east from Sacramento met the Union Pacific building west from Omaha.

With a silver hammer Governor Leland Stanford, one of the builders of the Central Pacific, drove a golden spike into a laurel tree—and all the country made "whoopie" over the completion of the first transcontinental railroad.

At the radio celebration May 10, from 9:30 to 10:30 p. m. Pacific standard time, the story of the conquest of the Sierra and of the desert—one of the epics of pioneer accomplishment—will be told. The "theme music" as they say in the movies, will be the songs and tunes of the 60's, with Reginald Werrenrath as the principal singer.

A prize of \$100.00 will be given to the boy or girl 18 years old or younger who sends in to KPO or to the Southern Pacific company, the best account of the story told over the radio.

Werrenrath's contribution to the program will include Invictus Huhn; The Railroad Cars Are Coming; Tider; The Hot Eye Man; The Builder, Cadman; Ben Holt; Kness; Zambonango, Cator; solo part in Battle Hymn of the Republic.

BUILDING PLANS WILL BE ALTERED

SALEM, Ore., May 2.—Once more the plans for construction of the state office building are being held up, this time by a protest lodged with the state board of control by the supreme court. The main objection of the supreme court members is that the new building, constructed as a duplicate of the supreme court building and connected with the latter by a center unit, will make several dark office quarters, and that while in the process of construction the noise and confusion will greatly interfere with the work of the court.

Chief Justice Coshaw and ex-Chief Justice Rand, as a committee of the court, appeared before the board of control Wednesday of this week and formally presented their protest. The members of the board immediately got in touch with the Portland architects who prepared the plans. Architect L. D. Howell, of Knighton & Howell, conferred with the board yesterday, and today Howell telephoned the board that he is prepared to submit new plans. Howell will present these plans to the board tomorrow.

KOTSONAROS DOWNS THORNTON

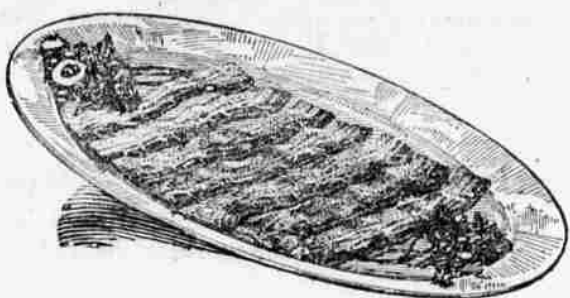
