MYRTLE CREEK WOMAN IS DEAD

MYRTLE CREEK, May 10.—Lydia Savage was born May 4, 1841, in Montreal, Canada, and came to the United States in 1844, moving to Oregon in 1893, settling in Roseburg, and 1896 moved to Myrtle Creek where she had since lived continuously.

She was married to C. M. Hamilton about 1861. They had four children, three of whom are still living. One son, Isaac, is believed to be somewhere in California. A daughter is in New York and one son, Jackson C., resides at Myrtle Creek, where he took care of his aged mother for several years.

She was married to F. A. Aderton in 1906, but was again widowed about the year 1922.

She passed away on May 4, 1929, her birthday, aged 88 years.

The funeral service conducted by the Rebekahs Monday afternoon at the Christian church, the pastor, Rev. C. A. Shaw, officiating, was beautiful and impressive.

Many floral tributes were made tokens of the regard held for Mrs. Aderton by her friends and neighbors.
