

BUSINESS WOMEN TO CONVENE IN EUGENE FRIDAY

The fifth annual state convention of the Oregon Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs opens in Eugene Friday, May 24, for a three-day session.

More than 400 visiting members and delegates from 17 clubs in Oregon are expected to attend the convention for which the Eugene Women's club of Eugene will be the hostess group.

Miss Minnie Hair, member of the Eugene club, is the state president and will preside at the convention. Mrs. Hanna Brain of the Klamath Falls club is the general chairman for the convention.

Mrs. J. K. Bowman, national first vice president of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs and whose home is in Richmond, Virginia, is coming as the national visitor for the convention. She will be one of the main speakers during the convention.

Miss U. G. Dubach, of Oregon State college, Corvallis, is to be one of the principal speakers at the meeting.

Convention headquarters are to be at the Eugene hotel. All business sessions for the convention will be held in the McMoran and Wightman store auditorium.

Clubs to be represented at the convention include Astoria, Astoria, Olga Bay, Coquille, Corvallis, Eugene, Grants Pass, Hillsboro, McMinnville, Medford, Oregon City, Portland, Pendleton, Roseburg, Seaside, The Dalles and Klamath Falls.

On Friday, May 24, from 3 to 5 o'clock the opening session on the convention program will be held when reports and announcements will be made. The executive committee meets for dinner at 6 o'clock.

At 8 o'clock Friday evening will be held the reception for all club members and visitors in Alumni hall of the Woman's building.

Saturday morning, May 25, comes the club's emblem breakfast at 7:30 o'clock at the Eugene hotel. Convention business sessions and round-tables will be held from 9 to 12:30 o'clock.

An international luncheon for which Dean Dubach is to be the sponsor, will be given at noon at the Eugene hotel.

In the afternoon, 2:30 to 5 o'clock will be held the vocational round-tables. These events are new features this year, as worked out by Miss Hair. There will be talk of them, one for office work, one for clerical office executives, etc., a second for sales women, and those who sell; a third for women who own and operate their own

business, and a fourth for the professional women.

All business and professional women, whether or not members of the club are to be invited to these meetings for the round-tables.

At 7 o'clock Saturday evening will be held the formal banquet at the Osburn hotel when Mrs. Bowman will give her talk. At 9 o'clock comes the stunt program at the Rex theatre and presentation of new club charters.

The complimentary breakfast to be given by the Eugene club for all members and visitors is to be given Sunday morning, May 26, at 9 o'clock at the Eugene hotel when a short religious service will be held.
