house two miles from the burning car. Physicians reported that she suffered only from shock, scratches and bruises.

Two automobiles loaded with officers sped to the scene of the attack, but had failed to find traces of the bandit this morning.

Prosecutor Skeptical
Miss Huller said she was in a stupor until the firing awakened her, and she fled, while flames covered the car. Her assailant was unmasked, she believed.

Prosecutor Charles Greenough said "I feel certain that we have not been told the entire truth about this matter."

The stories told by Johnson and Miss Huller had differed in several respects.
