In the struggle that ensued, Kille was shot in the leg and was latered into unconsciousness with a gun butt. The robbers then took Tribbey's car, loaded the men in it and drove for the mountains.

After several hours of aimless driving they halted near Greer, nine miles southeast of here, tied the men to trees, left one of their number to guard them, and drove away. After four hours the three bandits returned, got their position and drove away again. Kille and his companions escaped in a few minutes. Kille, seriously but not dangerously hurt, was taken to a hospital here.

Kille said the bandits intimated that the need of an automobile to rob a store at Pierce, a lumber town in this region, caused the double holdup. The robbers took \$200 from Tribbey and \$11 from the lieutenant governor, however.

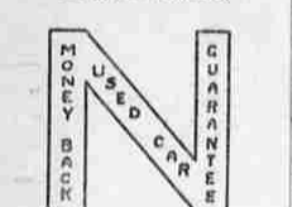
