

NEW LAW PROVIDES \$6,000 SALARY FOR JUDGE HAMILTON

(Associated Press Local Wire)
SALEM, Ore., June 13.—A re-adjustment in the salaries of Oregon circuit judges, provided for by an act of the 1929 legislature, was made public yesterday by Secretary of State Hal E. Ross.
Under the new law judges in judicial districts having population of 30,000 or more shall receive \$6,000 a year, with \$500 additional provided locally in the case of Multnomah county. Judges in districts having between 15,000 and 30,000 population shall receive \$5,500, and those in districts of less than 15,000 population \$5,000.
Judges in the \$6,000 class include James T. Brand, J. W. Hamilton, and George F. Skipworth, serving Benito, Coos, Curry, Douglas, Lane and Lincoln counties.
The new law became effective June 4. Under the old law all judges of the circuit court received \$4,600 with \$15,000 additional provided locally for those in Multnomah county.

DR. J. B. HORNER GIVEN HONORARY DEGREE BY WILLAMETTE UNIVERSITY

CORVALLIS, June 13.—During the commencement exercises of Monday morning at Willamette university, Salem, that university conferred the degree L. H. D. on Dr. John B. Horner, professor of history at Oregon State college. In conferring the degree special mention was made of Dr. Horner's record as an educator and author.
Dr. Horner was graduated from Willamette University in 1885 with Colonel Percy Willis of Portland and Associate Judge George M. Brown of Salem. He also was a classmate of the late Edgar B. Piper, editor of the Oregonian for many years.
As a writer of Oregon history, Dr. Horner probably has become as generally known over the state as any other individual citizen. He has resided in Oregon from his boyhood days and is thoroughly familiar with its development and an acquaintance of scores of men who have made its history.

Dr. Horner is well known in Roseburg where he resided for many years as an instructor in the local schools. He is a frequent visitor here.

Henry Booth displayed samples of the new currency at the regular Rotary club luncheon today and told the members of the club of the development of national banking and currency.
Frank Norton appeared before the club representing the Roseburg chamber of commerce. He told of the work of the Western Oregon Traffic association, an organization sponsored by the chambers of commerce of Oregon cities from Junction City south to Klamath Falls. The association is fighting for a lower freight rate for inland towns and has been fairly successful thus far but it is now necessary to take to Washington, D. C., a brief of the previous hearing. "The fight is 60 per cent won," Mr. Norton said, "but we will need more funds to carry on to a successful conclusion." A committee of the chamber of commerce will canvas business interests here in an endeavor to raise the quota assigned to Roseburg, he said.

Frederick, one of the founders of the store 49 years ago, and John McKinley, first vice president of Marshall Field and company. Neither would discuss the terms of the sale. Frederick and Nelson is recognized as one of the largest department stores on the Pacific coast.
Frederick said he planned to retire. William H. St. Claire, formerly of Portland, Ore., at present vice-president of Frederick and Nelson, will become president and general manager.

BAPTISTS CLEAR BISHOP MCCONNELL OF CHARGES

Dr. Sloan alleged that the bishop had given approval of the teaching of the theory of evolution in a pamphlet issued by the American civil liberties union in 1927.
