

ANNUAL RED CROSS SWIMMING SCHOOL TO START JULY 1

George Hughling, Instructor at University of California, Coming for the Third Time

Classes Open to Persons of All Ages Without Cost; Persons Unable to Swim Invited.

Announcement was made this morning that arrangements have been completed for the annual Red Cross swimming school, which is scheduled to open July 1. George Hughling, swimming instructor from the University of California, is to be in charge of the school again this year, his third consecutive season in Roseburg.

This campaign is sponsored by the Douglas county chapter of the American Red Cross at a cost of \$10 per day, and the service is furnished free to every person who desires it. For many years the Red Cross has been interested in life saving. At first the method was to teach resuscitation to persons already able to swim, but in recent years the organization has worked along the idea that it is better to avoid accidents, by having all people able to swim, than to endeavor to restore them to life after they have been nearly drowned. Upon the adoption of this policy a plan was devised whereby swimming instructors of proven ability are employed to travel throughout the country, stopping one or two weeks in each community and holding classes in swimming instruction. Thereby people are taught to swim, and those already able to swim are instructed in rescue work, resuscitation, etc., and are given advanced instruction. Last year 70 persons were taught to swim, while almost an equal number received the advanced work in Roseburg.

Mr. Hughling is swimming instructor at the University of California and is in great demand during his vacation season. The Red Cross, however, has secured his services, under contract, and he is conducting classes in this territory. He is considered one of the best instructors in the country, and has shown excellent ability in teaching persons to swim, particularly persons who have had a fear of water. By some peculiar means he has demonstrated success in being able to overcome this dread and has instilled confidence and love of swimming in place of the handicap previously encountered. The Umpqua Park company has

granted the Red Cross free use of the beach and the club house, making it possible to use the building with its dressing rooms and showers for both men and women, thereby making it much more convenient for the classes.

Water Good This Year
Due to the high water during the winter and the continued rains the South Umpqua is suitable for bathing above the old dam, according to reports made by the health officer. The river is still high and impurities have been carried away. Usually by this time the water is at low level and has become stagnant in spots, so that it becomes unsafe for bathing. But this year no such danger exists. Before the swimming school was arranged a test was made of the water, and the river was declared to be safe for such use and will probably continue so until the low level is reached, which will undoubtedly not come about for several weeks.

Classes will be provided morning, afternoon and evening from July 1 to 6, and persons of all ages are invited to take the swimming courses, which will be absolutely free of all charge.

The only requirement is that persons desiring to take the courses register in advance, so that the schedule can be arranged. Dr. H. C. Church is the chairman of the first aid and life saving committee and has the necessary registration blanks, which may be procured at his office. It is urged that every boy or girl, or man or woman not able to swim take advantage of this opportunity to learn to take care of themselves in the water. They have the assurance of learning to swim under the direction of one of the coast's outstanding instructors, and within a week's time should be able, even without any previous knowledge, to be able to swim at least sufficiently to take care of themselves under ordinary conditions and will also have confidence and ability to enjoy themselves in the water.

WEST COAST PLANE "TAKES OFF" FROM AIRPORT THURSDAY

The plane landed here enroute south because of motor trouble. Kenneth Householder and Gordon Burnett mechanics have been occupied during the past week installing a new motor to replace the one wrecked when a piston broke and was ground up through the working parts of the other motor.

Warming up shortly after two o'clock the plane was in readiness to make the flight back to Portland. Leo DeVaney, superintendent of the West Coast Air Transport, was present to make the trip and with the mechanics went over the machine, preparatory to making the flight north. Glenn McAllister of the Terminal hotel and agent for the West Coast made the flight with DeVaney, Householder, with Hersch Laughlin at the stick. The plane taxied down the field and without hesitation lifted from the ground and disappeared above the clouds north of here. Above the clouds it was the plan to fly by instrument.

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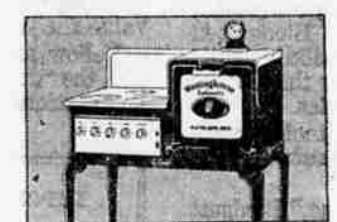
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
