DURING the past year, as our readers know, we have tried to sketch, in an interesting and instructive way, the early history of our state and our community.

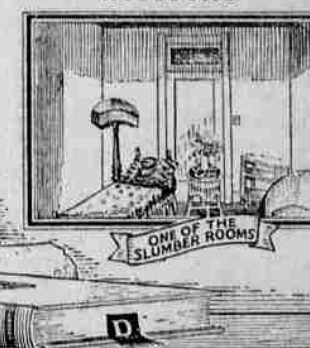
