SLIDE LECTURE ON JAPAN PRESENTED BEFORE ADVENTISTS

Victor Armstrong, returned missionary from Japan, gave a stereoscopic lecture on the progress of the work of the Seventh-day Adventist denomination to a large crowd in the pavilion on the Umpqua park grounds last night. He related experiences in connection with the earthquake in Japan a few years ago and showed pictures of the demonstrations wrought by the upheavals of the earth and the bodies of the dead piled up like cord wood. He said so far as they were able to ascertain not a member of the church perished and only one individual belonged to the churches sustained any injuries at all. Other members from the various churches throughout the southern part of the conference are pouring in to enjoy the blessings over this week-end of the camp meeting. Morris Lukens, president of the North Pacific Union conference, will speak tonight, giving his reasons why he is a Seventh-day Adventist. Tomorrow is the day the Adventists observe as the Sabbath and special services are scheduled at 11 a. m. and 2:30 p. m. Many conversions have been made on the camp grounds thus far and a baptismal service is planned for tomorrow at an early hour. The services will continue all day Sunday, closing with the evening meeting on Sunday night.

MANY SIGN FOR SWIMMING COURSE

Ninety-eight applications have been received for swimming instruction at the Red Cross school which starts Monday, under the direction of George Huchling, swimming instructor from the University of California, according to the report made this morning by H. C. Church, local secretary. This instruction is furnished without cost, and classes will be held morning, afternoon and evening for all persons over the age of 8 years desiring to take the course. Mr. Huchling will give instruction in advanced swimming and life saving for persons already able to swim, and is particularly desirous of instructing persons who cannot swim. This is an opportunity for persons who do not know how to swim, to learn this art under the care of the leading instructors on the coast, without cost, as all expense is born by the local Red Cross chapter. Due to the growing popularity of bathing, fishing, boating and other water recreation, it is felt by the Red Cross that every person should be able to swim in order to prevent accidents to himself and in order to be able to save the lives of others, and for that reason instructors are employed to travel about the country and hold classes in each community where local cooperation can be secured. Mr. Huchling can be secured larger classes than are already signed up, and anyone desiring to take the course should make application immediately at Dr. Church's office.
