

COST OF EDUCATING HIGH SCHOOL PUPIL PAST YEAR \$154.54

Average Cost for Each
Grade School Student
Found to Be \$98,
Clerk Reports.

The average cost of educating each high school pupil in the Roseburg schools is \$154.54 per year, according to the annual school clerk's report filed by Mrs. A. J. Geddes, clerk of the local district, covering the past year of school activity. The average cost for each grade school pupil is \$91.01. The Rose school was operated during

the past year at the lowest cost per pupil, \$71.52 and the senior high school the highest, \$162.76. The average cost per pupil at the junior high school was \$129.53, and the Benson school \$85.34 and at the Fullerton school, \$39.20.

The report shows a very good financial condition, the schools having been operated within the budget allowance with total expenditures during the year of \$230,061.61. Of this amount, \$90,195.93 was expended in retiring warrants, and \$11,000 was paid for bond retirement. The bonds on the junior high school will be paid off in 1933 and the senior high school bonds in 1944.

The clerk's report, which contains a great deal of interesting information concerning the city schools, is as follows:

Tax Money Due

The report shows that the district has approximately \$90,000 outstanding in unpaid warrants, but there is due approximately \$40,000 under the tuition law. This law provides that where there are districts that have no standard high

school, the children may be sent to an adjoining district. The district to which they go determines the cost of educating the pupil for the year, and a bill for the amount is submitted to the county school superintendent. A tax is then levied upon the district from which the pupils come, and the county superintendent pays the amount to the district that provides the education. The supreme court, in a recent ruling, holds that the county school superintendent shall issue a warrant upon the county treasurer in payment of the amount due regardless of whether or not the money has been collected.

C. A. PARK QUILTS STATE BOARD AFTER 18 YEARS' SERVICE

INVENTOR SUING FORD FOR MILLION

LOS ANGELES, June 29.—Charging the Ford Motor company with infringement on his invention of an oil feeder, Albert E. Nichols yesterday filed suit in federal court asking damages of \$1,000,000. He believes, will approximate one million dollars.

The complaint alleged that the automobile manufacturers were at the present time using the feeder which had been patented by him. It asked for an injunction to prohibit the use of the invention and a court assessment of damages after an accounting.

An amount three times the actual damages "in view of the deliberate and willful infringement," was asked in the complaint.

Ulbrich the details. He was told only that Miss Gentry had suffered a broken arm.

Doctors said Miss Gentry had suffered a severe fracture of the skull, fracture of one arm in two places and one fracture in the other.

Three refueling operations, two of them dangerous feats out over the ocean kept the Three Musketeers in the air through its third night. Southern Cross On Wing
SINGAPORE, Straits Settlement, June 29.—The airplane Southern Cross, with Captain Charles Kingsford Smith and three companions aboard, left here today in continuation of its flight from Sydney, N. S. W., to England. The next stop probably will be at Singapore (Malay) and Swatow (China), on the eastern coast of the Malay peninsula.

Ohioans After Record
CLEVELAND, June 29.—Pilots Roy L. Mitchell and Byron K. Newcomb were flying over Cleveland airport today following their second successful take-off in an attempt to break the world's endurance record for planes refueled in flight. They took off at 6:38 yesterday afternoon after being forced down by a storm earlier in the day during the first attempt.

The plane was refueled at six o'clock this morning, almost twelve hours after the flight was started. The pilots signaled that all was well.

To break the world's record of 172 hours they must remain aloft until almost noon Friday.
