## CLEAN UP DRIVE

### FINDS FAVOR IN SOUTHERN DOUGLAS

All people contacted in the southern part of the county are favorable to the clean up and paint up campaign, reports Maurice Newland, general chairman of the "city and valley beautiful" campaign being conducted under the auspices of the chamber of commerce.

Chas. W. Rice, editor of the Myrtle Creek Mail, heartily endorses the campaign and suggests that the triangle at cross junction be beautified. He plans to carry publicity on the campaign in his paper to help stimulate interests in the city of Myrtle Creek. Other persons in Myrtle Creek have also expressed themselves in favor of conducting the campaign there.

Elton Hollenbaugh of Canyonville, councilman and proprietor of the Pacific Highway garage, believes an active campaign is needed there. His experience has shown that tourists stop where places are most attractive.

John Hamlin, Canyonville meat market proprietor and member of the council, reports his business has almost doubled since he moved into the new quarters from his old place. He believes that the different organizations in Canyonville should be assigned certain work to do and be started as soon as possible.

Glendale is going through a period of reconstruction and now is a logical time to be thought to be given to beautification of the city. 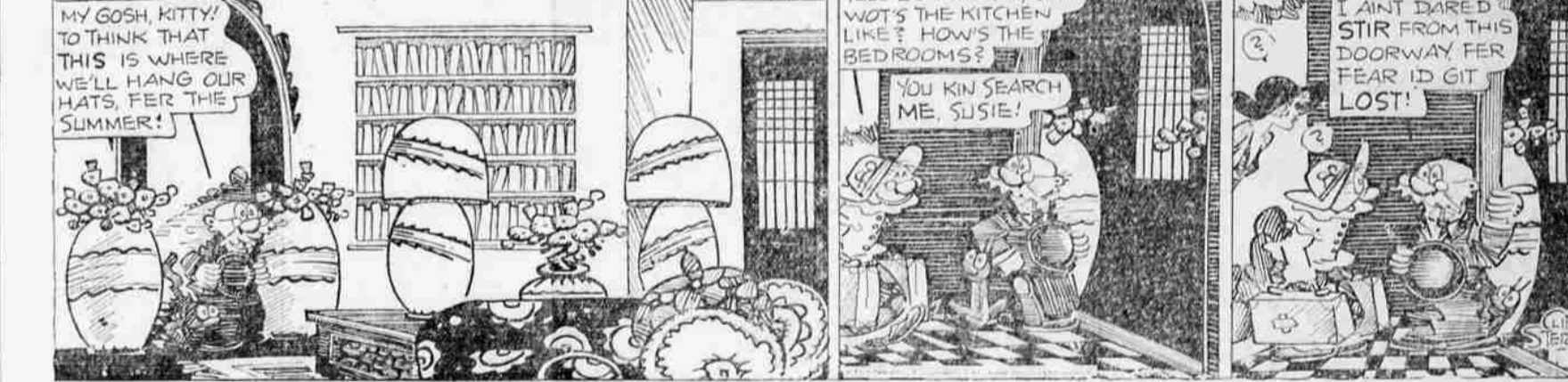
