PORTLAND, Ore., July 12.—The first carload of red and white grapes from California was reported received today. They are reported to be of excellent quality. The white wholesale at \$1.25 and the reds at \$5.

Oregon celery was unusually plentiful and said to be of the finest quality ever offered the trade. It wholesales at 70, 85 cents and \$1 a dozen bunches.

Egg, butter, poultry and fresh meat prices were unchanged.

A few crates of strawberries sold for \$2. Raspberries were stiffer in price at \$1.75 to \$2. Blackberries and Loganberries showed no decline at \$1.75 and \$1.25, respectively. Red currants were up 25 cents at \$1.75. Peas were a cent higher at 4 cents.

New apud took an advance of a cent to 3 cents. Tomatoes were likewise higher at \$3. The first lot of Black Republican cherries brought 5 cents a pound. Asparagus from Hood River brought \$3.75 for box of 24 dozen bunches. Apricots were \$1.40.

The first consignment of peaches from The Dalles arrived today. They were excellent in size and appearance and needed keeping for a day or two to be fully ripened. The price was \$1.25.

Other prices were unchanged from those of Thursday.
