When you talk about the future of aviation, you generally talk about airplanes. To most of us the dirigible, while fascinating to watch, does not figure greatly.

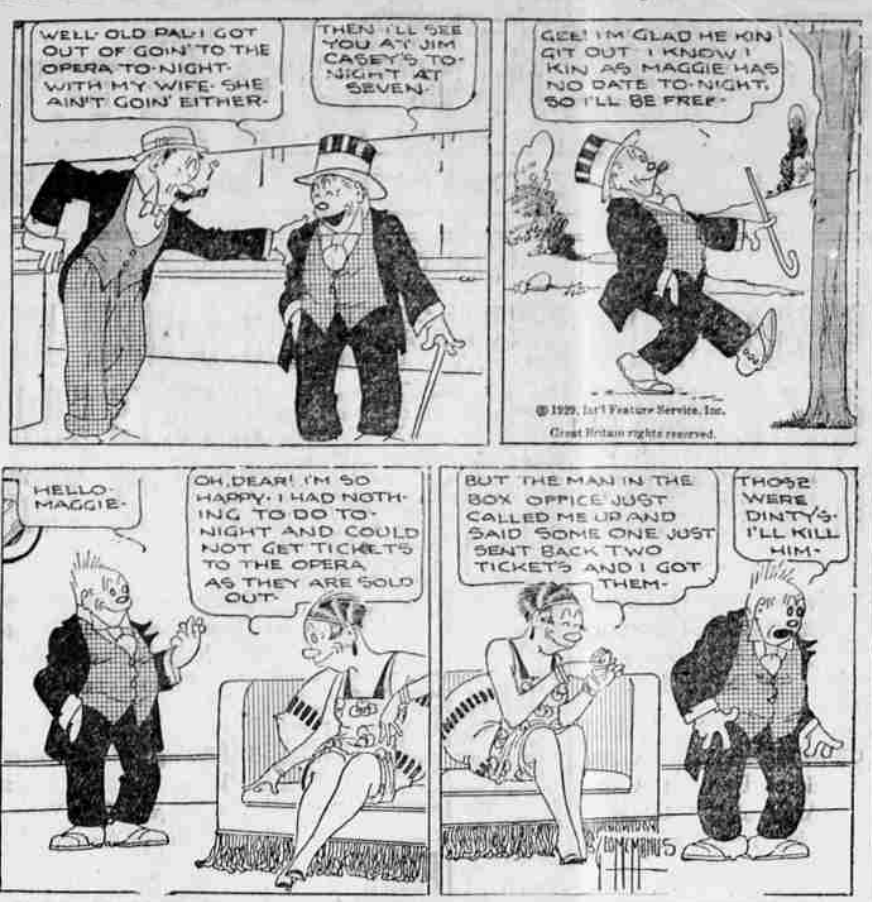
The first steel skyscraper ever built is now being torn down in Chicago. Put up in 1887, it is now out of date, and is being removed so that a bigger structure can take its place.

BUTTER MAKERS FACE FEDERAL PROSECUTION

CHICAGO, July 16.—Henry J. Halaban, assistant U. S. district attorney, announced yesterday he would start action in federal court shortly charging eight butter manufacturers with violating pure food laws.

Similar suits against 33 other manufacturers are to be instituted within a week, the government attorney said. Names of the firms implicated were not made public.
