GRIDIRON TRAINING SAVES CHAMP'S SKIN

(Associated Press Local Wire)

LOS ANGELES, July 25.—Gridiron tactics which won for him the world's heavyweight wrestling championship, enabled Gus Sonnenberg to retain that title today, the result of two straight falls over Joe Malcewicz of Utica, N. Y., before 10,000 fans last night.

A terrific body slam, which climaxed 42 minutes and 22 seconds of rough and ready grappling, paved the way for victory for the former Dartmouth football star. The second and deciding fall followed after 11 minutes and 42 seconds of wrestling.

The Utica panther found himself no match for the college boy, who alternated his flying tackle and headlocks with telling effect, wearing Malcewicz down to the point of submission. Both falls resulted directly from the terrific tackles made by Sonnenberg, followed by body slams.

The Olympic auditorium was packed, with paid admissions amounting to more than \$30,000.

NOT ONE DULL MOMENT IN GREAT JUNGLE FILM

"Simba," the motion picture record made by Mr. and Mrs. Martin Johnson, the famous explorers, during four years in the jungles of Africa, is at the Auditor Theatre today, Friday and Saturday, and is one of the most exciting and thrilling films ever seen in this city. It holds not one dull minute from the time the Johnsons lead the outfit for their long trek into the jungles up to the starting climax when half-civilized natives, armed only with slender spears, surround and kill full grown lions.

Marching across the screen come antelopes, giraffes, zebras, rhinos, hippopotamuses, herds of elephants, leopards—all the denizens of the jungle just as they are at home. And they are photographed with a clarity and against such wildly beautiful backgrounds that the value of the film is wonderfully enhanced.

Among the outstanding features of the film are the charge of the infuriated rhino straight at Osa Johnson, who is forced to shoot him to save her own life; the stampede of a herd of elephants, seeking safety from a jungle fire; the swarms of ugly crocodiles infesting the rivers that the party was forced to cross; the gorgeous show of running giraffes of speeding antelopes and zebras; perfectly marvelous flashlight photos of lions and leopards; and above all

the scene which shows fourteen lions, playing in a grassy glade like a lot of big cats.

Shoots Charging Lion

One sees Osa Johnson shoot a charging lion that falls within 20 feet of her. This young woman, who evidently has no fear, calmly stalks some of the most dangerous animals to get them into places where her husband can photograph them.

But really the great kick is when "Simba," that is the native word for lion—makes himself a nuisance by killing off the herds of the natives, and the blacks, with only their spears, turn the robber into a pin cushion, dodging his charges and hurling their spears until he falls dead.

"Simba" is a picture that should not be missed. It has thrills that are real, not of the Hollywood variety, and more than that, it is a picture the like of which will not be seen for years and perhaps never again.
