CHIEF INDUSTRY
OF 36 NATIONS
IS AGRICULTURE.

Salvator Has Biggest Farm
Percentage—U. S. Only
Country Without
External Debt.

NEW YORK, Aug. 3.—Agriculture remains the leading industry in 36 of 49 countries included in Redmond and company's latest mathematical symphony of the economic world.

Eight of the remaining 13 countries depend on farming as a secondary industry.

Salvador reports the largest percentage of its area under cultivation of any country in the world. The total is 76 per cent. Cuba is next with 75 per cent, followed by Spain with 73 per cent and Italy with 68.6 per cent. Eighteen and eight-tenths per cent of area and 77.6 square miles composing the United States are under cultivation.

Debt Statistics

The United States is listed as the only country in the world with out an external debt, with the exception of Russia, which repudiated debts of the czarist regime amounting to \$11,460 per capita.

Equator, Paraguay, Venezuela, Spain, India, New Zealand and Russia are the only countries without public or private debts in the United States.

One effect of the war is evident in the fact that the countries owing money to the United States government are all European countries. On the other hand, the largest foreign loans floated in the American investment market have been for the account of Canada and Spanish America.
