

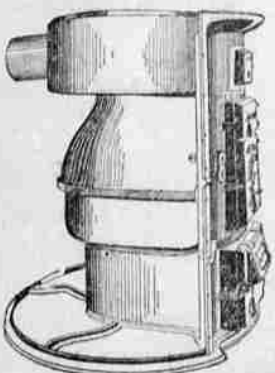

NEW EXPERT WILL STUDY SAWMILLS

C. J. Telford, until recently extension forester for the state of Illinois, has been appointed to the

staff of the forest products laboratory, maintained by the Forest Service, United States Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the University of Wisconsin at Madison, Wisconsin. He will take charge of the laboratory's small sawmill study. Telford is a graduate of Yale forest school and his extension and research work in Illinois cover a period of more than eight years.

One of the important needs in the portable sawmill operation in Telford's opinion is improved marketing—perhaps through a centrally located manufacturing or concentration plant where the lumber can be properly marketed and the higher grades and more acceptable sizes accumulated in quantities sufficient quantities to

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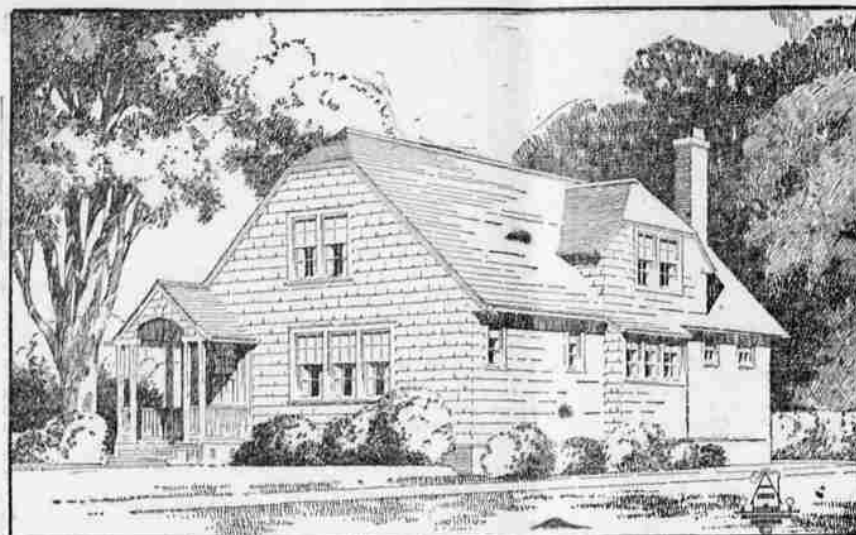

Bungalow Designed For Narrow Lot



Straightforward Economical Type

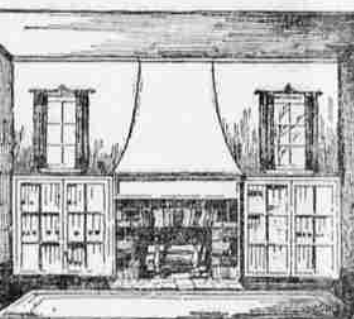
PERHAPS the most popular type of house in our country today is the five room bungalow—popular because it is economical to build and because with all the rooms on one floor the labor of housekeeping seems for many women to be less arduous.

This house, design 5-C-1, is a five room bungalow, having the additional wanted feature of extra space under the roof where two additional bedrooms may be gained.

Entry to the house is through a front vestibule, where there is a coat closet. Directly off of this is the living room with fireplace at the end and bookcases at each side. There is a group of three windows at the front of the room and single casement windows over the bookcases. A large eaved opening leads to the dining room. Here there is a projecting bay with a battery of three windows, providing space for a built-in or separate buffet.

The kitchen is arranged for a coal burning range. If gas is used a different order of the fixtures may be planned. A doorway leads to a stoop at the rear and to the stairs to the basement.

At the left of the house are arranged two bedrooms with a bath between. Each bedroom has a large closet. There is an additional closet in the hall, which access is gained either from the kitchen or



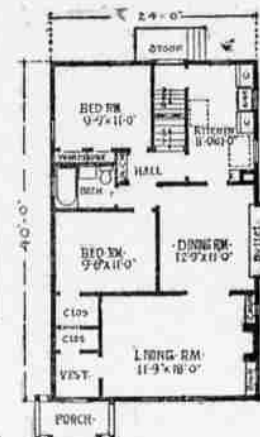
A View of the Living Room

from the dining room. A stairway leads from the hall to the attic space.

The construction of this house is straightforward and, therefore, economical. The rectangular quality of the plan is responsible for this. As for the exterior, there are no extravagances to lead to unnecessary costs. The porch, bay window, and dormers give the necessary elements of interest. Close eaves are planned, first of all to improve appearance because such eaves are always finer appearing on small bungalows of this type than the wide overhanging form which is commonly employed, but, of course, the close eaves are also much less expensive.

The exterior finish of this house, as shown, is of large shingles. They may be painted white or stained a



silver gray with white wood trim. The house will also look very well with wide siding. The brick base course and stoop and the brick steps are recommended as they will greatly improve appearance.

Construction: Wood frame, exterior finish shingles or siding. Roof of wood or composition shingles. Facing: South or west. Should be reversed for other facings.

Lot size: House can easily be accommodated on a 40 foot lot. In some cities 30 feet would suffice. If necessary, the porch can be set over so as to avoid the projection into the side yard.

FOREST FIRES SO FAR THIS SEASON DO LITTLE HARM

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 5.—It is anybody's guess as to how August will turn out in the theoretical height of the forest fire season, according to bulletins received by the Western Forestry and Conservation Association from federal, state and private protective agencies from California to Montana. Conditions over the Pacific coast vary between extremely dry and dangerous, with lightning storms increasing the hazard, and occasional light local rains which reduce it temporarily. Losses so far have been light, except for grass, grain and brush fires in California; not true forest fires. Generally speaking, the protective agencies are holding their own so far. Careless recreationists are almost universally reported the greatest present danger.

Of all the 1929 fires reported, totaling 3375, California has had 1351; 356 on forest service lands and 998 elsewhere, but only 10,000 acres were timberland, with small forest loss. The Klamath region was the worst hit.

Oregon has had 447 fires; 247 on federal lands, but only 2020 acres of timber burned with loss of perhaps 12 million feet—only about one good timber claim, if condensed. Lightning has been troublesome.

Washington has had 121 government and 297 state and private fires since the season opened. Timber loss is negligible. Loss of logs, logging equipment and settlers' improvements is a trifling \$12,000 only. Of the 297 non-federal fires so far, 66 are ascribed to smokers, 43 to campers, 38 to

lumbering, 25 to railroads and brush-burners, 31. Chief danger from now on is laid to recreationists.

Montana and Idaho report 1156 fires, with conditions in the national forests, due to lightning, apparently the most critical on the coast. Several fires are out of control. Governor Erickson has issued a proclamation urging extreme caution and it is being distributed over western Montana by airplane. So far it is an erratic season, with high hazard now reported, but also with protective agencies extremely successful so far. The situation is better than at this time last year, but weather conditions are threatening. Forest visitors and logging operations constitute the chief hazard. Law enforcement officials are on their toes, promising short shifts for violators of laws, penalizing smokers, campers, slash-burners and careless loggers.

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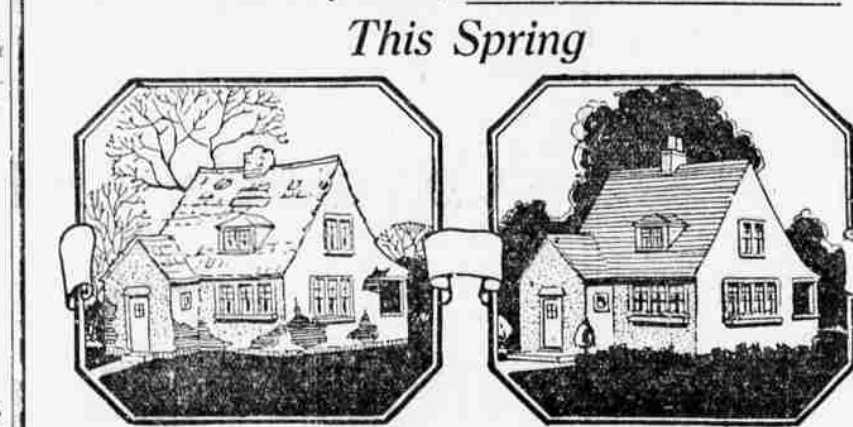
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
