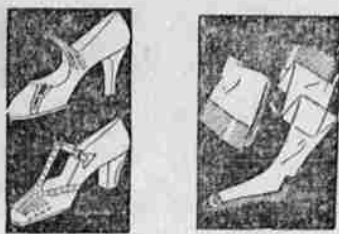

The Umpqua Roundup at Oakland, sponsored by the Oakland Gophers and the Oakland unit of the American Legion, started off in great style this afternoon. Due to a breakdown of two of their cars the ballyhoo group failed to arrive for the scheduled parade last night, after a trip to Ashland, Grants Pass and Medford, so Manager Farleigh postponed the opening of the rodeo from 11 o'clock this morning to 1:00 p. m. and brought the band and a group of his riders to Roseburg this morning and paraded the street. The band gave a short concert, several of the riders were introduced to the crowd, and Frances Annie Lawrence, the 16-year-old cowgirl singer, delighted the crowd by singing "The Utah Trail."

Oakland was thronged this afternoon as the roundup opened. Concessions have secured booths at all available space in the city and at the fair grounds. Special attractions of the afternoon were the buffalo riding and bulldogging events.

Lindbergh did that on a Detroit automobile company proving ground track yesterday and after a half hour of driving around the concrete oval in an eight-cylinder car could scarcely be persuaded to stop.

The flying colonel averaged 106 miles over a 21-mile track with banked curves but hoisted his speed to 112 miles an hour on the stretches.

A visit to the proving grounds to test the new Packard Diesel airplane motor gave Lindbergh the opportunity to do his speeding. He took the Diesel-powered plane up for several minutes' flight.

Packard Motor Car company officials said he was the first, except the Packard pilots, to fly a plane powered by the oil burning engine.

VICTIMS OF AUTO WRECKS IMPROVING

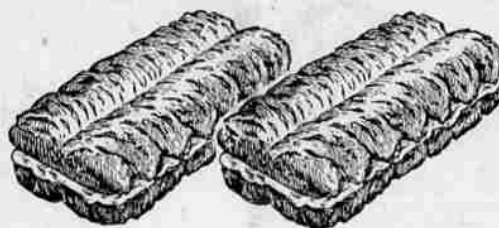
