Quarrel Over Peruvian Butler Causes Diplomat to Resign Post

When Mrs. Miles Pindexter, wife of the former United States Ambassador to Peru, brought back a native butler from the South American republic, she probably had no idea that his employment would be the ultimate means of creating a row in Washington that would cause the resignation of a diplomat and considerable ill feeling in Peruvian official circles. Yet this is exactly what happened.

The Peruvian butler as estimable in his way as the admirable Crichton, was brought by the Pindexters to Washington from Peru. He soon was the envy of the other Washington hostesses.

Finally Cornelius, the butler, seeking higher wages, decided to quit the Pindexter household. He gave notice and was accepted as butler by Senor Gonzalez Prada. Mrs. Pindexter called Senor Gonzalez Prada on the telephone and is said to have told him she would complain to president Leguia of Peru unless he released the butler. Senor Gonzalez Prada informed Mrs. Pindexter Cornelius preferred to stay with him.

The next day the Peruvian diplomat received a peremptory cable from his government in Lima, Peru. It read something like this: "Return Cornelius to Mrs. Pindexter."

The cable was signed by Dr. Pedro Jose Rada y Gamia, the Peruvian Minister of Foreign Affairs. This the Peruvian diplomat refused to do, and he tendered

Foreign Office, remarkable for its short tone, follows: "The orders contained in your cablegram are unjust and shall not carry them out. Mrs. Pindexter declined to comment on the incident today."

FIREPROOF VAULT BEING ERECTED FOR X-RAY FILMS

Construction of a fireproof vault on the roof of the Perkins building to provide a place for safe storage of x-ray films of the inflammable type, has been started by the Roseburg General Hospital Co., which has leased the building. Due to the terrible disaster at the Cleveland clinic, hospitals all over the country are providing safe depositories for their stored films, and many of them have adopted the plan of building fireproof vaults on the

roofs of the buildings, thereby eliminating all danger from smoke and flames that might prove disastrous if vaults were otherwise located.

It is planned to use the new type of non-inflammable films when obtainable, but the vault that is being constructed will eliminate all danger even in the storage of the old type of films.

All equipment and apparatus in the laboratory, x-ray room and maternity department will be of a type approved by the national fire underwriters, Dr. Twitchell states.

The work of remodeling the building to provide complete hospital accommodations is proceeding rapidly.
