THREE SEAMEN TO  
GO TO TRIAL FOR  
SAN JUAN HORROR

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 5.—Charged with inattention to duty, Captain H. O. Bleumchen and Third Officer Otto V. Saunders of the Standard Oil tanker S. O. T. Dodd, and Robert Pappentun, third officer of the steamer San Juan, today were ordered held for trial by United States steamboat inspectors at the conclusion of the federal investigation into the sinking of the San Juan August 30 with a loss of seventy-two lives.

The specific charges placed against them by inspectors Frank Turner and Joseph Dolan was "inattention to duty and unskillfulness in the navigation of their respective ships". The trial of the three officers will be held before the same inspectors.

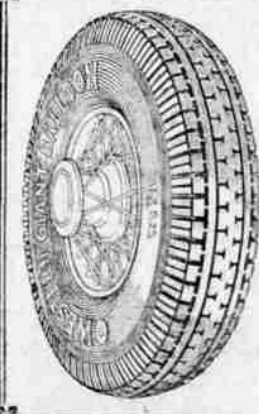
