NAVY LOBBY INVESTIGATION

THE INVESTIGATION ordered by the United States senate of the activities of American shipbuilding companies at the futile Geneva conference of 1927 on limitation of naval armament is bound to have a good effect.

The immigrants we do not fear. Who do so much our land to cheer, Are those who can enrich our soil And bless our brawny sons of toil.

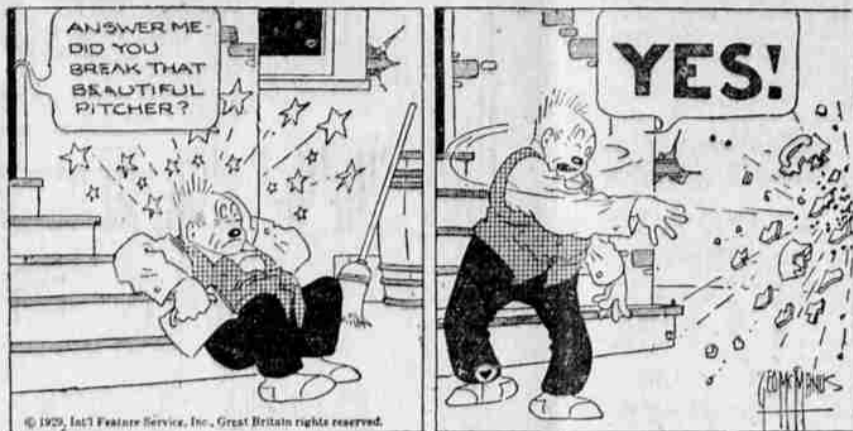
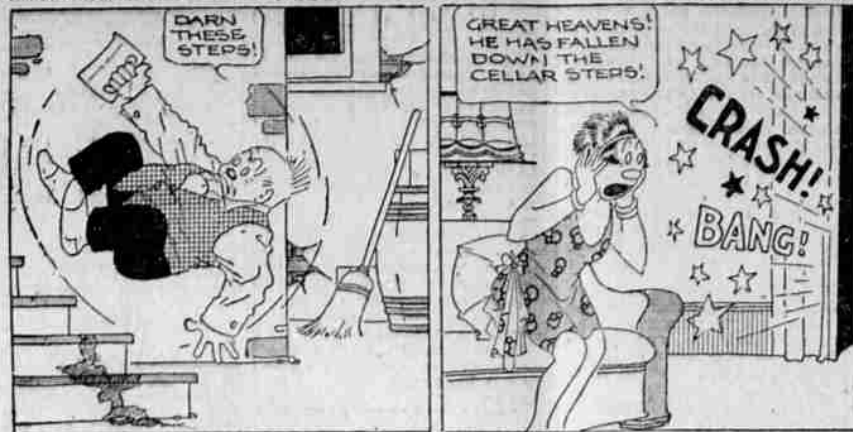
There is no land on earth exempt; We're always seeking to preempt Some gift of God discovered there That fits us here; and find just where We do not rob another land.

BALANCE THE DIET—ADD A DASH OF WIT

Make Certain the Necessary Elements are Included in Your Daily Menus, Says Authority, but Be Sure Your Meals Are Cheerful, Gay Occasions.

TO KEEP the average person well and "fit" takes considerable intelligence. Happy is the housewife who realizes the great importance of serving well-balanced meals to her family folk.

A balanced diet is one that supplies all the food elements in the right proportion necessary for building up a healthy body.

There are a few general facts that will help in choosing a proper combination of foods. A good rule is the following: One part protein—that is meats, eggs or other dairy products. Three parts fats—such as butter, cream, oils, cooking fats, oily nuts and fat meats. Six parts carbohydrates—as sugar and starches in potatoes, cereals, bread, sugar and all sweets.

It is to be remembered that milk is the most important of all foods, and one of the cheapest as well. Children would be better off by having a quart of milk a day, and for adults at least a pint should be taken.

Meals should be made attractive by having "things look nice." Pleasant color and form, together with suitable food combinations, will go far toward making an appeal to the eye as well as the palate.

For various dishes with just anything for a makeshift. Garnishes for various dishes will add to the attractiveness of the food.

And remember that meat times should be a happy occasion. Fun and laughter should mingle with interesting bits of conversation, and business worries and household cares should be saved for another time.

Have a tranquil mind while eating, for the sake of good digestion. It was not a bad time in the olden times in palatial halls to send for the court jester to help entertain and make merry at meal time.

"Laugh and grow fat" is a saying of old, then we might employ such tactics in up-to-date breakfasting, lunching and dining.

DEAR MRS. BECKMAN: Will you please tell me if a black satin dress or coat are considered "in mourning"?

I am in mourning and would like to know whether black satin is considered mourning and whether it is permissible to wear it.

E. C. G. SATIN is not considered in good taste to wear when one is in mourning. No material that has a high light is considered mourning.

Mourning materials should be dull materials. Besides, it is possible, perhaps, for the material to be turned wrong side out, and wear it on the dull crepe side?

DEAR MRS. BECKMAN: May a widow of three weeks wear gray for mourning instead of black? She is very nervous and black depresses her very much.

Her husband died very suddenly after an illness of only three hours. If so, please tell me what material to use, whether the veil should be all gray or gray bordered with black, or what material, and so forth. If it will not be suitable, please let me know.

B. C. G. TO ME it is the way of nonsense for a woman, under these circumstances, to wear mourning.

Survive at all times, for how does she have used whatever brightness and comfort she can get out of non-black, and if she finds this comfort in gray, she should, by all means, wear it. It would be better for her not to

wear gray satin or any other material that has a lustre. No should she wear gray and black, since this is too obviously trying for a substitute. She would not wear a veil, either.

In the house she should wear all white, and in summer she would wear all white. This is, as you know, as "deep" mourning as all black. Then, at other times, she would wear gray, lightweight gray flat crepe, with a matching hat and other accessories.
