Roseburg citizens are invited to the county to come and attend the jubilee and are preparing plenty of entertainment. The committee will pay \$20.00 for a slogan that will describe and advertise the event. A slogan contest blank is printed elsewhere in this newspaper. The contest will close Friday evening and all names or slogans must be in the hands of the committee by that time. The entrants in this contest should mail their slogan to the Roseburg chamber of commerce office for attention of the slogan committee.
