Mrs. Mamie Cachola, teacher at the Bangalow school near Dixonville, was a business visitor in this city today.

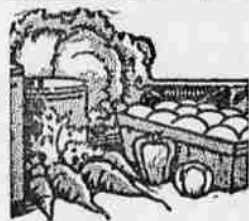
Drive to Portland—
