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May Resign



Julius Manic, Premier of Roumania, who has threatened his and his cabinet's resignation unless purported statements by Queen Marie of Roumania involving the position of the dynasty, are repudiated. It was reported that Queen Marie desired to regain some of her former political power through her election to the Regency of the country. The Roumanian Party, now in power in Roumania, having no members on the Regency, was said to have attempted to bargain with the queen, suggesting that she be named Regent only on condition that Prince Nicholas resign his position on the Regency. Queen Marie declined this, it is reported, and challenged the Premier's attitude by allegedly saying "It is not permissible to contemplate replacement of Prince Nicholas." She is also said to have made such a vigorous thrust as "families which attempt to raise themselves to the level of a second dynasty." It is these remarks which are said to be the cause of the Premier's threatened resignation.

Commonwealth Edison, which closed Saturday at 34 1/2, dropped to 32 1/2 during the first two hours, and Cities Service fell to 32 after finishing Saturday at 47.
