Two men have been intimate friends from pioneer western days, when they started together on the road to fortune. Two so-called loan having the bribery charge was covered by a promissory note, from which Fall's name was removed. It was explained, to save him embarrassment in the event of the holder's death before the note's maturity. When Fall left Washington after the transaction, he carried the money in a black satchel, from which the case against him derived its popular name.

Doheny, it has been announced by the prosecution, will be brought to trial next January on the charge of tendering the bribe. When the verdict against Fall was announced, Doheny who was in the court room, brandished his fist in anger and attributed the conviction to "that damned judge."

Fall said today he had no statements to make at this time. He waited for fifteen minutes for his new bond of \$5,000 to be prepared for his signature. It was signed by the National Surety company.

over given a government in Ontario, the conservatives today regarded the election as vindication of their policy of government sale of liquor.

Inaugurated three years ago by the government of Premier G. H. Howard Ferguson, the government control act was the principal issue in yesterday's general election. The progressives demanded honesty legislation and the liberals a plebiscite.

The conservatives, holding 75 of the 112 seats at the dissolution of the last legislature, increased this number by 15 with four seats still doubtful today. Premier Ferguson, whose government was returned to power for the third time, was himself elected with a majority of more than 2,000 votes over his prohibitionist opponent, the Rev. T. H. Bradley.

Four women who aspired to be the first of their sex to sit in the legislature all met defeat. Four communists, including Tim Breen, leader of the movement in Toronto, also were defeated.

Premier Ferguson, who had expressed extreme confidence that his party would be returned to power, said he would be guided in his policy of liquor control by a vote of the people.

His opponents charged the liquor control act was a failure and that crime and drinking were increasing.

FALL PLEADS WITH AMERICAN PEOPLE FOR THEIR FAITH

(Associated Press United Wire) WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—Albert B. Fall, sentenced earlier today to serve a year in jail and pay a \$100,000 fine for accepting a bribe while a cabinet officer, in a long statement this afternoon asked that the American people not "believe me guilty of the damnable crime of which I am innocent."

"Words cannot express my astonishment at the recent verdict of the jury holding me guilty of bribery," Fall said. "I know that I am innocent and that the record clearly proves it."

SUSPECTED LIQUOR BOAT TAKEN; 2 MEN ON BOARD WOUNDED

BUFFALO, N. Y., Oct. 31.—Two men were shot and a third arrested early today in the capture on Lake Erie by a patrol boat of the motor cruiser Butterfly, formerly the Uncas, said to have been used in carrying liquor from Canada to United States ports.

According to coast guard officials the Butterfly had fought two battles this past summer with the patrol fleet on Lake Ontario, but due to the fact that her hull is sheathed in steel plates, the craft had always been successful in eluding capture.

In overhauling the Butterfly today, Captain Hubert P. Wilbur of the patrol boat reported that no fire arms nor liquor was found on board.

The wounded men under guard today at a Buffalo hospital were reported as not in a serious condition.

BURTON'S SEAT IN SENATE MAY GO TO JAS. R. GARFIELD

(Associated Press United Wire)

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 1.—Governor Cooper today began serious consideration of selection of a United States senator to succeed the late Theodore E. Burton.

The list included James R. Garfield of Cleveland, son of the former president; Colonel Carmi Thompson, Cleveland; William H. Boyd of Cleveland; Colonel Edward E. Edwards of Cincinnati, banker and manufacturer; Charles R. Frederickson of Coshocton, manufacturer and former republican state chairman; and Roscoe C. McCulloch, Canton, chairman of the state utility commission.

Indications were that Garfield had swung into the preferred list. His selection, it was believed, would have the endorsement of the Hoover administration insofar as the president could or would take a hand in the matter. Garfield is a close friend of Postmaster General Walter F. Brown who was President Hoover's strategist during his pre-convention campaign last year.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—President Hoover will adhere strictly to his hands off policy in the matter of the selection of successor to the late Senator Theodore E. Burton of Ohio.

Inquiry today at the White House brought the response that Gov. Cooper of Ohio had not communicated with the chief executive regarding the appointment.
