ROSEBURG TEAMS TO MEET MEDFORD AND GRANTS PASS

Roseburg football fans are going to have an opportunity to witness a couple of good games, Friday and Monday. Friday, at Finlay field, Roseburg junior high school meets Medford juniors at 3:30 p. m. This game, an annual affair, is always a real battle, as the two teams live in anticipation of the contest during the season. Medford is reported to have a heavy, fast squad, while Roseburg's team is of medium weight, but is fast and plays a good brand of ball. Both teams have plenty of fight, so, regardless of which team wins, the spectators are assured of a real exhibition.

Because of the age of the boys they are limited to 16-minute quarters, so they will not run the danger of exhaustion, and this permits starting the game at 3:30 o'clock so that there will be very little time lost from school.

Coach Warburton's boys are well trained and make an excellent showing. They are determined to win and are going into the game with the purpose of fighting until the last whistle for a victory. They will have, however, an equally determined opponent. In the Medford team, and will probably be facing superior weight and experience.

Monday afternoon the senior high school team will play against Grants Pass as a part of the Armistice day program. Grants Pass has an experienced team, as most of the men remained over from last year. Roseburg, on the other hand, has practically an entire new team this year. These two teams play on Armistice day each year, alternating between Roseburg and Grants Pass. The game Monday will start at 2:30 p. m.

The American Legion Auxiliary is assisting the high school in the ticket campaign, and is canvassing the business district. The students are starting a canvass in the residential district today. The

athletic fund of the high school is low, and the school is depending upon the attendance at the Armistice day game to raise sufficient funds to meet the needs for the season.

SALEM COP SHOOT CLYDE WILLIAMS

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 7.—Clyde Williams, 26, lies in a Salem hospital with a bullet hole through his right lung as the result of having been shot early this morning by Policeman Louis Burgess on North Front street, when Williams refused to stop after being called upon by the officer to halt. The shooting is believed to have been the outgrowth of a love affair which involved Alberta St. Clair, a local stenographer, and another

man whose identity has not been learned. The officer was called to the St. Clair home by the girl's mother, who said a man was prowling about the place. Williams emerged from a parked car in the St. Clair driveway and fled.

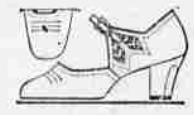

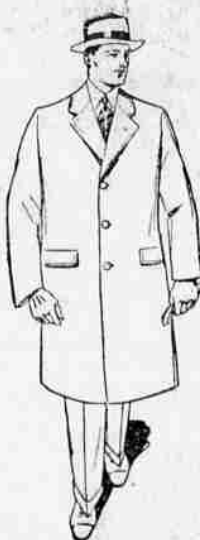
