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TODAY'S MARKETS

(Associated Press Special Wire)

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 19.—No change was made in either egg or butter prices at the close of today's market. Egg quotations, however, were weakening at other markets, especially at Seattle, where declines of 4 cents on extras and one cent on mediums were reported Monday.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable markets, the Portland news bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

Continued good weather is prolonging the fall fruitfulness season. With about 10 cars estimated available a week ago, loadings have been curtailed to 2 cars daily, since that time on account of delayed maturity. Moisture and warmer weather would still increase total fruitfulness or shipments from the district. 2 or 3 cars of cauliflower, celery, and other mixed vegetables are being loaded daily also.

Marsh seedless grapefruit from Texas is now available on the Portland market, and prices show an advance over quotations earlier in the season. Other varieties of citrus fruit are expected to arrive from the Dallas in small quantities, but quality is inferior with a prevalence of frozen stock.

Western demand for Oregon celery shows and dealer undertone on account of increasing volume of California's celery offerings. Quality of California celery, although not quite equal to Oregon's, is good enough to make stiff competition at about 30c per crate, discount.
