TODAY'S MARKETS

(Associated Press List)

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 21.—The expected reduction in egg prices is on the way. Other cities already have participated in it and the movement was expected to hit Portland shortly. Seattle was down two cents on extras and three cents on mediums Wednesday, while San Francisco reported a drop of one cent on extras and two cents on mediums.

The butter market also was weaker with indications of lower prices.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland news bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

"Supplies of coolers and ungraded apples from the Hood River district are diminishing. There is probably considerable quantities of this class of stock still available in the Willamette valley, however, and until these supplies are exhausted, most varieties of wrapped and packed apples will meet with slow demand. Graded Spitzenbergs are moving into consumption at a fair rate; this movement being necessary on account of unusually early maturity, a possible scarcity of Spitz after Thanksgiving, is forecast by some apple dealers.

Celery is being washed and trimmed by some shippers, before loading for shipment as a safeguard against injury to outer leaves and stems from field frost. The carrot celery market is barely ready for stock in this rough, but washed and trimmed celery is selling for \$5.50 to \$7.50 per crate, in carlot, local, and truck shipments.

"Portland is reputed the lowest market on the Pacific coast this week, in the California lettuce and tomato markets. The market for these commodities is in good shape, but Portland happens to have an oversupply of both products.

"Carrot loadings of mixed vegetables is probably at its season's peak this week, with as many as 6 cars daily from the Portland area. This heavy movement is removing all indications of surplus vegetable production and offerings on the local markets are much lighter than would ordinarily be the case.

"Cranberry movement continues slow. The suggestion has been made that housewives apparently are all waiting for the day before Thanksgiving before making their cranberry purchases."

Hops Again Moving

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 21.—A market hop market has come to life and within the past few days 1038 bales of valley hops have been sold after a long period of inactivity broken only now and then by a few small and spasmodic sales. While the recent sales have been only of prime quality hops and at prices ranging from 15 cents down to 14 cents for hops which it is estimated cost around from 12 to 15 cents a pound to produce, nevertheless the sudden buying
