WOLF DRAGS TRAP 27 MILES BEFORE DEATH TAKES HIM

(Associated Press Local Wire) TORONTO, Ont., Nov. 28.—A large grey wolf, which for months has terrorized the large herds of deer which roam through Algonquin park, is dead. The manner in which he died won for him the admiration of the government foresters at the park who were formerly his bitterest enemies. Traps had been set for the big lumberer in vain. It appeared he would never be caught.

Jim Shields chief park ranger, finally overtook the wolf by placing a cunningly laid trap fastened to a four-inch pole. Waiting the snare one day, Shields found the trap gone and evidence of a mighty struggle. The wolf had snatched the trap away with him, Shields and assistants then followed the trail and after 27 miles of tramping came upon the body of the wolf with the trap still clinging to his foreleg.

JAP MINISTER TO CHINA SUICIDES

(Associated Press Local Wire) PEKING, China, Nov. 29.—Friends of Sadao Saburi, Japanese ambassador to China, who committed suicide yesterday in Japan, believed the responsibility of his past preyed upon his mind. He told intimates prior to his departure for Japan that he considered the Japanese minister's task in China almost hopeless. "Helping is the most difficult part in Japan's diplomatic service," he said. Saburi's wife, who was the sister of the Marquis of Komura, died in Peiping in May, 1926, during a tariff conference to which Saburi was delegate. She was a linguist and otherwise very accomplished. Friends said he never fully recovered from the shock.

"TALKIE" TO TAKE PLACE OF WILL, IS LINDSEY'S VIEW

(Associated Press Local Wire) DENVER, Colo., Nov. 28.—And now another use for the talkies—Ben S. Lindsey, former judge of the juvenile court, has visualized the departed benefactor of the future talking directly to his survivors and heirs, after having dispensed with a written will by using a talking motion picture in making his bequests.

Lindsey also sees the day when court clerks will discard their pencils and turn the crank of a talking movie machine instead. "It may startle some persons—this idea of a dead man coming back to make his will, as it were," said Lindsey, "but I believe that some day this will be the custom. There would be little basis for dispute among heirs if the person himself would tell exactly how he wished to dispose of his estate."

40 NEGRO CHILDREN, DEAF, SAVED FROM FIRE

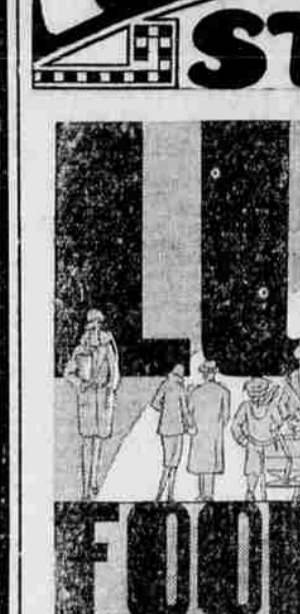
