Morgan said, the showing now being made at Leeper Dome would justify the expenditure of thousands of dollars for tanks and equipment in preparation for handling the oil that would be practically assured.

The Leeper Dome field, however, is untested, and until the hole is proven, the entire venture is a gamble and should be looked upon as such.

Will Match Funds.

He agreed that he would match the funds raised by the Oakland Oil company to complete the work, regardless of the amount.

J. W. Perkins stated that he had received reports from one of the most eminent geologists of the country who had made a very careful survey of the formation and that it was predicted that production would be reached between 2,500 and 3,500 feet.

A number of talks were made, the sentiment of the meeting being that as long as the well is so near the level where production is to be expected, that the project should not be allowed to drop. It was felt that completion of the well is a community service. Either it should be proven that there is a producing field existing, or else it should not be allowed to drop. If there is no further use to put money into oil development projects, with only such a comparatively small sum needed, the new felt, the community would be lacking in ambition, courage and confidence if the project should be dropped without being completed.

Many were confident that production would be secured, but all felt that, regardless of such prospects, the work, now so near completion, should be finished to furnish proof one way or the other.

After a lengthy discussion, in which there were a score or more speakers, it was decided to conduct a campaign for funds in Roseburg, Oakland and Sutherlin. Men present pledged nearly \$1,000, while others are announcing the amounts of their pledges today. J. E. McClintock, J. W. Perkins and H. C.
