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PETITION PROTESTS PLAN TO PARDON EX-BANKER

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 12.—A petition signed by about 300 citizens of Lane and Coos counties was today received by Governor Patton protesting against the movement for the parole of Henry L. Bergman, former president of the Florence bank, who is serving a seven-year penitentiary sentence for embezzlement. Several days ago the governor received a lengthy petition and a number of letters from prominent people of Lane county asking that Bergman be paroled. Also a committee from Eugene waited on the governor in Bergman's behalf.
