struck a pile of large boulders. She slid white on the way to the Roseburg General hospital. Mr. Smith suffered only minor injuries.

Mr. and Mrs. Smith had been spending the day in Roseburg doing some Christmas shopping, and started home shortly after dark.

Brakes Cause Skid—Near the grade crossing at Shady Point, a few miles south of Roseburg, they met the Sutherland car, which was coming into Roseburg. Apparently Mr. Smith, who was driving the car, applied his brakes to reduce his speed, and the car started to skid towards the left side of the road.

The Sutherland car pulled out into the shoulder of the highway, but the Smith car's rear fender hit the side of Mr. Sutherland's machine. The impact, while not sufficient in itself to cause any material damage, caused Smith's car to swerve across to the right side of the road, where it went over the bank, turning over once and landing upright.

No Inquest to Be Held—Smith was driving a touring car and the top was crushed when the machine hit on top of a pile of boulders. Mrs. Smith's head apparently hit violently against the rocks, the blow being sufficient to fracture the skull and cause a cerebral hemorrhage.
