ROSEBURG'S UNIT OF OREGON GUARD NEEDS RECRUITS

Active steps to increase the strength of Company D, 162nd Infantry, Roseburg's national guard company, assigned to machine guns, are to be taken during the next few weeks. Uniqua chapter, officers' reserve corps, has accepted the task of sponsoring the reorganization work, and will endeavor to encourage Roseburg boys to take up military training, because of the many advantages which it offers, as well as for the purpose of maintaining a strong and active guard unit in Roseburg with its appreciable income.

The company requires 15 new enlistments within the next 30 days and will need 30 enlistments in 60 days in order to bring it to effective minimum strength. Because of the fact that many members have been lost through removal from the city, additional recruits are immediately necessary.

While enlistments in the company are solicited, the officers of the guard company are accepting only young men of good reputation and character, as undesirable members in the past have caused the company to lose standing in the community and has made it difficult to secure the more desirable young men. This condition has, however, been eliminated, and the officers are carefully safeguarding the company against any future trouble of this kind.

Support of civic organizations is to be requested, as the company is believed to be of civic benefit, due to the large amount of money it brings into the community each year.

usually to about \$15,000, while the guardmen receive \$1,700 in pay at their annual summer encampments. The state also spends about \$900 yearly on the armory, making about \$18,700 income for the city each year as a result of the activities of the local unit. As the men are paid for each drill attended, the larger the company the more money that comes into the community.

Unless the company is recruited up to its effective minimum strength within the next 60 days, it will probably be discontinued, by order of the regimental and battalion officers, and Roseburg will lose the returns from the organization, while the young men who have an opportunity to benefit financially as well as in training, will lose such benefits.

The company not only offers an opportunity for military training, the officers point out, but also has a program of sports and pleasure, as the armory has club rooms for the guardmen, basketball, indoor baseball and volley ball courts, and gives much attention to recreation.

How Training Aids—The officers also point out that while the national guard and reserve components are military organizations, yet such training does not mean militarism in any phase, but is a protection to the young men themselves. Statistics from the World War show conclusively that the percentage of casualties was astonishingly less among regular army and national guard men than among the men who had had no previous training. As all young men are subject to draft in the event of war, their own chances of survival in warfare are greatly increased by the military training that they will gain in the national guard, and continuance of national guard work is a definite step in the conservation of life during national emergencies.

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
