Prices of all grades were advanced a cent a hundred by wholesalers. Cash price of berries was quoted at \$2.00 and beet sugar at \$1.25.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

Cauliflower prices are the lowest of the entire season. Continued heavy shipments from California have practically demoralized eastern markets, and a surplus of Oregon stock also is being confirmed. An occasional carrot is being confirmed at 10c per crate with stock in market only realizing 5c to 10c. Local production is still considerably below normal.

Prices of Portland's commodities are higher at California shipping points, and shade higher at Portland, with some sales to retailers as high as 6c per lb.

New arrivals of naval oranges show improvement over earlier receipts. Prices on smaller sizes were advanced slightly, but demand for these are moving to retailers at \$2.00 per bushel, mostly with occasional sales a trifle cheaper.
