HARVARD IDOL OF PAST DAYS LAYS HIMSELF WITH GUN

CHICAGO, Dec. 17.—Despondency appeared today as the only motive for the suicide of Hunt Wentworth, Gold Coast bachelor and sportsman and son of the socially prominent Mrs. Moses J. Wentworth.

Wentworth's body, a bullet wound in the forehead, was found last night in his mother's Lake Shore drive apartment, a revolver clutched in the right hand.

A grand nephew of "Long John" Wentworth, mayor of Chicago in 1860, Wentworth was a Harvard graduate and was prominent in campus activities. He was editor of the Lampoon and in his senior year was voted the handsomest and "funniest" man in school. In the war, he served as a captain of infantry with the Blackhawk regiment.

Two months ago, announcement was made of Wentworth's marriage to Miss Helen Smith and the wedding had been tentatively set for this spring.

NEWS OF OREGON FISH AND GAME

Bad Kintzler, of Fall creek, Lane county, has his Christmas money and at the same time has saved the lives of approximately 200 deer through his work with dogs and rifle during the days between November 28 and December 2. He killed four cougars in that period of time and drew \$100 in bounties from the state game commission. Now that there is less work about farms in deer countries hunters are warning to the sport of cougar hunting and the kills recorded in the commission office are mounting rapidly.
