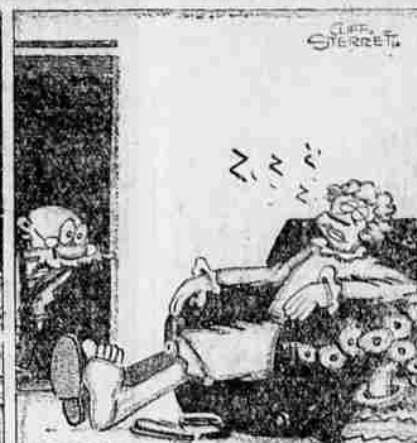

HONG KONG, China, Dec. 23.—The Chinese steamer Lee Cheong, with her Chinese officers and crew and 250 Chinese passengers, including many women and children, sank late Saturday night with nearly all on board.

The vessel was caught in a violent storm shortly after leaving Swatow Saturday afternoon for Hong Kong and went down at midnight, swamped by huge waves.

Two seamen clinging to wreckage were picked up yesterday and brought here.
