CHANCELLOR JONES DECLINES JOB ON INTERSTATE BODY

(Associated Press Leased Wire) KNOXVILLE, Tenn., Dec. 31.—Chancellor Robert M. Jones, of the Knoxville chancery court, whose nomination for interstate commerce commissioner was sent to the senate by President Hoover before the holidays, today declined the appointment. He said he could not accept, "even if confirmed by the senate."
The nomination of Chancellor Jones, which met opposition from several senators who had not been sufficiently established, was sent to a committee of the senate for further consideration.
"I do not see how any man could go on the commission," Chancellor Jones said today, "and feel absolutely free and unembarrassed in discharging his duties under his oath, for he knows that however righteous his decisions may be, the fiery wrath of some sections, class or interests, is sure to fall upon his head. I do not want the place under such conditions."
The chancellor is a republican.

VICTIMS TURN ON THUGS, KILLING ONE, INJURING PARTNER

(Associated Press Leased Wire) NEW YORK, Dec. 31.—Eight men in an establishment in West 53rd street, described by the police as a speakeasy, turned on two holdup men early today, beating one of them to death and seriously injuring the other.
The victim was identified by the police from his fingerprints as William Rogers, 24, of this city. His record showed an arrest for robbery last month. The other said he was Timothy Shine, 18, of Brooklyn. He denied that a hold-up had been attempted.
James Kelly, the proprietor, said he and his partner, James Gavin, were behind the bar when the two men entered. There were four patrons in a rear room and two at the bar. He said Rogers and Shine ordered two drinks apiece and then putting their hands in their overcoats pockets as if holding pistols, ordered the bartender, himself and two patrons to place their hands on the bar.
All four men complied, but hearing voices in the rear room the holdup men ordered the four to the rear room also. As they started for the rear, one of the intended victims expressed doubt that the holdup men had guns, and picking up a baseball bat hurled it. The bat struck Rogers on the head, felling him. The others then joined in an attack on them. When the police arrived the two men were lying on the floor, one of them dead. The patrons had disappeared. Shine, who suffered severe lacerations and bruises of the head and a fracture of the right wrist, was held on a charge of attempted robbery. Kelly and Gavin were charged with suspicion of homicide.

OAKLAND OFFICIALS OPTIMISTIC ABOUT FORTHCOMING YEAR

Optimism for the coming year was the keynote of addresses made by officials of the Oakland Motor Car company at a convention of dealers and factory representatives held in the Masonic temple at Portland last Saturday. The purpose of the gathering was called by G. R. Jones, zone sales manager, and was conducted by a special factory delegation headed by H. E. Mahaffey, western sales manager and L. M. Dreyfus, Pacific coast regional manager. Edward Lyons, factory mechanical expert, was also one of the speakers.
Beginning at 10 a. m., the sessions lasted throughout the day, with recesses for luncheon and dinner. The purpose of the gathering was to discuss with representatives of the company in this sales zone plans and policies of the Oakland Motor Car company as outlined with relation to the merchandising of Oakland and Pontiac automobiles. In addressing the assemblage Mr. Mahaffey said in part:
"We are making no rash predictions regarding increases in automobile sales next year, but intend to manufacture according to the retail demand as reflected by our dealer's forecasts. There will be no crowding of cars on dealers; if they are overloaded at any time it will be for the reason that they will have ordered more cars than they can well handle.
"However, since we realize that factory sales will be limited only by retail sales, we expect to give our dealers more help than they have ever received from us in the past in the actual soliciting and promotion of retail sales."
H. T. Hansen and Wm. Stilling of the Roseburg Motor company, local distributors, who were among those in attendance at the Portland convention, have returned with an enthusiastic report on the prospects of their own organization for the coming year. Mr. Hansen asserts that he has been promised the closest co-operation by national, regional and zone officials.
