

MARKETING ACTS OF U. S. FARM BODY HELD DANGEROUS

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Jan. 22.—A resolution condemning the agricultural marketing acts as "unfair" and of "socialistic character," and acts of the farm board as arbitrary and inconsistent, today was sent by the directors of the Kansas City board of trade to the agricultural committee of the chamber of commerce of the United States in Washington.

A stand against "further government interference in business" being sought.

The act was passed "to quiet years of agitation," the resolution charges. It is "based in character, far-reaching in its effect upon existing business, and of a socialistic character foreign to the principles of our government," it is charged.

"The federal farm board, charged by the law with its administration, has embarked upon policies which must be viewed with suspicion by business men everywhere," the statement continues. "It is using government aid and public funds to interfere with prices and legitimate business, to foster unfair competition, to build uneconomic facilities, and to endanger honest business enterprise and investment."

PARROT FEVER TAKES TOLL OF HUMAN LIFE

As mysterious as the tropical forests of the Amazon, whence it comes, the latest epidemic to strike fear into the heart of man has made its simultaneous appearance in South America, Germany, Poland, and various parts of the United States.

Paritachosis, or "parrot fever," one of the rarest and most dangerously infectious diseases known to man, made its terrible appearance, bringing with it an agonizing death that is the outcome of characteristics similar to those of influenza and pneumonia. It strikes so suddenly and seems so mysterious.

First mention of the disease came in news from Buenos Aires where the star and eight members of the cast of a play at the Liceo theatre, were stricken with a mysterious malady that seemed to be a frightful combination of typhoid, pneumonia and malaria. The death of the parrot that was used in the performance prompted the health department of Buenos Aires to have the bird brought to its laboratory immediately, and very soon the reason for the mysterious epidemic was known. In the campaign to stamp out the disease 30 per cent of Argentine's captive parrots were slaughtered. The star of the company is recovering from the disease, but his tortures have been indescribably frightful. For weeks he was strapped to his bed.

In Germany paritachosis has made its appearance in Hamburg and Dresden with fatal results. One family of nine contracted the disease from a newly purchased bird, and is not expected to recover. In London a doctor has died from the effects of the disease.

In the United States the first cases were reported from Baltimore, where eight cases are being watched. Toledo and Cleveland

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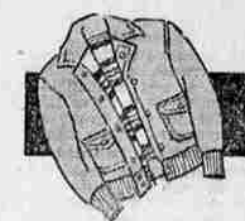

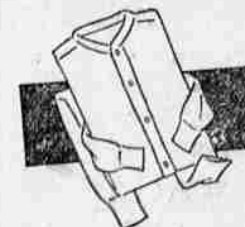
