OPPOSE FEDERAL AID FOR PRIVATE WATER PROJECTS

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 28.—

The Oregonians today that recommendations submitted to congress by the bureau of reclamation as a result of an economic survey last year set forth that the federal government should not extend financial assistance to private reclamation projects in Oregon. Including those now submitted by the Snake View, Standford, Horse Fly, and Westland irrigation districts, but should take steps to insure financial stability for such federal projects as the Umatilla and Owyhee.

Certain objections to assist sections on private projects are suggested in the report, the newspaper's Washington correspondent said, which included waiting of interest payments on bonds due from the Snake View project, a requirement for the Standford project to be worked out jointly by the government and Oregon and a modified contract for the Westland district which would extend the time for payment of water charges to 40 years. This contract covers the purchase of water from the McKay reservoir.

The field investigators who studied the Umatilla project, concerned in the tentative decision at ready reached by the reclamation bureau to write off all delinquent charges and title to the irrigation systems and transfer all rights to the two districts, with the understanding that the government will expend no more money on the project. The request of the districts that construction payment be continued until the project is completed should be refused should not be granted, in the opinion of the investigators.

The report laid the present unhappy financial condition of the Snake View district to lack of settlers and the lack of elimination of some areas too distant to be reached without excessive distribution costs.
