NEXT BOXING CARD, FEB. 24, PROMISES LOTS OF THRILLS

Pendergrass to Meet Fast Albany Youth in Main Event; Whole Bill Looks Classy.

A boxing card promising plenty of action has been arranged by Clyde Ward, local promoter for Friday night, February 24, and will be presented at the Roseburg armory. Featuring the card will be an exciting main event between Pendergrass and George Goodman of Albany. Goodman holds about the same position in the Willamette valley that Pendergrass holds here. Both are favorites in their own localities, game fighters and clever boxers. They have defeated all class rivals in their own localities and the contest between the two youngsters should furnish a great deal of excitement.

The semi-final between Kid Miley of Suburbia and Red Hanks of Eugene, is another event promising lots of thrills, for both boys are hard fighters. Kermi Shaw of Coquille will fight Dynamite McCormick of Butte in the special event. Shaw fought here recently against Buzz Ramsey of Eugene, breaking his hand in the match. He has been anxious to secure another fight in Roseburg, as he feels that he did not make a good showing because of his injury. McCormick fought Joe Corbett in the local arena early in the season in one of the fastest fights of the year, and has since been in hard training, so is in better condition than at his former appearance.

Pat Franco, local fighter, will meet Kid Willett of Coquille in the preliminary. Willett is a fast tough fighter and will give a good account of himself.

In addition there will be a curtain raiser and other entertainment.
