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WESTERN OREGON TRAFFIC ASSN. TO MEET FEBRUARY 27

Directors of the Western Oregon Traffic association will meet in Medford on February 27 to hear the report of Attorney Ellis of Salem, who has been representing the association in its plea for a reduction of railroad rates here before the interstate commerce commission in Washington, D. C.

The following cities of western Oregon are represented by their chambers of commerce: Ashland, Roseburg, Medford, Eugene, Grants Pass, Springfield, Cottage Grove, Sycamore, Klamath Falls, Myrtle Creek, and Corvallis.

A. O. Marsters of Roseburg is president of the association, and the body's program of rail rate reduction has been meeting with success in advance of the I. C. C. decision through competition of the Crescent City port and truck lines into the Rogue valley from the coast.

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
