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Just a Victim of Circumstance

SOVIET STRIVES TO REDUCE HOST OF UNEMPLOYED

MOSCOW, Feb. 25.—Collective farming is seen by the revolutionaries not only as a means of getting rid of the "kulaks," or private land owners among the peasants of Russia, but also as a method of checking the drift to the cities and thus relieving the unemployment situation.

The importance of this latter consideration has been emphasized by a report on the number of idle. The latest figures fixed this at 1,241,000 in the middle of January. Most of those who were out of work were women, or children under 15 years of age, and the big majority of the entire list was made up of unskilled labor.

The government statisticians who analyzed the figures concluded that the chief cause of the situation was the constant stream of peasants from the villages. These people were sent to cities by a desire to work in the large communities, rather than remain in the country.

In planning the project of industrializing farm work, the government has taken steps therefore, to make the collective farms as attractive as the cities. Recreational centers are to be established in the state rural communities and facilities given for the same sort of political and economic instruction that is afforded city workers.

The seven-hour day and "non-stop" working week with staggered rest days for all workers, are mentioned as other factors which will help reduce unemployment. It is estimated that the number of persons working for hire in the soviet union has doubled in five years. In August, 1929, the total reached about 12,000,000 and by the same time this year it is predicted that it will have grown to above 13,000,000.

Having more than a million and a quarter unemployed, and at the same time experiencing a lack of skilled labor, the government has opened a chain of trade schools for unskilled workers. These have been planned to instruct 150,000 in house building, 200,000 in factory work and as many as will in the operation of tractors and other farm machinery.

A definite percentage of women must be admitted to these training courses. Also, in order to give a chance to some of the thousands of unskilled youths who yearly enter the ranks of the unemployed, a special "industrialization camp" has been instituted by the Peoples' Commissariat of Labor which is planned to provide 60,000 apprentices for factories.

MERCHANTS HERE BROACH PLAN TO HOLD INSTITUTE

The matter of holding a merchants' institute, similar to the one conducted here two years ago, is to be taken up by the merchants of the city, through the chamber of commerce, within the next few days. The Oregon State college, which conducted the former institute, is offering to arrange another school here July 9 and 10, and immediate arrangements are necessary if the dates are to be secured.

The college secures experts in all lines of merchandising, dealing with salesmanship, advertising, window displays, credits, book-keeping methods, etc., who address the merchants along these lines.

The last school was of very marked benefit and it is expected that immediate steps will be taken to secure another such opportunity.
