PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 28.—Wheat and butter quotations were unchanged today but the undertone was weaker. Receipts have become larger, especially in eggs, and as a result storage of surplus is said to be increasing. Many believe the bottom has been reached in eggs, while others expect still lower prices. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says: "Honeydew cantaloupe shipments are being delayed by cold weather, and carlot movement will not start in appreciable quantity until about March 8 or 10. Early cantaloupe was mostly winter-killed in January, consequently, the entire Roseburg movement will be later than usual, with shipments probably continuing until April. Quality of next week's offerings is expected to be better than present shipments. Supplies of lettuce, celery, cauliflower, onions, and leached vegetables are liberal, wide local distribution is being secured, and prices are within the reach of everyone. Apples, oranges, cabbage and potatoes are in only moderate supply, and markets are firm for these commodities."
