CASH FOR FOREST ROADS WILL COME

Congress Expected to Appropriate Twelve Million for This Work.

Early passage by congress of the legislation to provide an annual construction of highways within national forests areas is predicted by Dr. E. B. McDaniel, Chairman of the National Roads committee of the A. A. A. and president of the Oregon State Motor Association, who is in Washington, D. C. in the interests of this and other legislation of benefit to western road development. Passage of the bill increasing the federal government allotment to forests roads from \$7,500,000 to \$12,500,000 would mean an additional three-quarters of a million dollars annually for Oregon forest roads.

Dr. McDaniel's prediction was made in a report to J. E. Shelton, manager of the Motor association, received yesterday. He pointed out that the differences of opinion on the methods of expenditure of these funds has been ironed out and that the bill is now being modified to meet conditions in the Pacific coast states. The representative of the Motor Association went to Washington to present the views of western motorists on this legislation. He held a series of conferences with western representatives, Senators and Bureau heads who have changed the administering road measures.

Dr. McDaniel pointed out in his report that while no serious difficulties were anticipated in securing enactment of this legislation, there was the possibility that the forest appropriations measure might be delayed as a result of its separation from the federal aid measures. This separation is a new policy made effective for the first time at this session of congress.
