PENDLETON. — Proposals of northern congressmen for a higher tariff on barley sacks is being opposed by wheat men in this section. The Pendleton chamber of commerce has urged Oregon's delegation regarding the situation which would mean higher costs to wheat men for sacks during harvest.

Associated Press (Leased Wire). PORTLAND, March 6.—Rice and butter prices remained weak and unchanged today.

In cattle markets were 25 a box higher, ranging from \$1.25 to \$1.50, according to size and fat. Vegetable exchange has moved to 3c a pound.

Reviewing the general farm and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

"Cool weather continues to delay maturity of vegetables in Roseburg, with the result that Portland's supply is light, and the market continues firm. Only one market shipment has been made from that district, and little shipping activity is expected soon."

Apples are moving slowly, for all classes except the cheaper sorts, which can be sold to retailers and peddlers at \$1 or less per box. Even this poorer stock is showing only moderate movement, thereby prolonging the marketing period for these lots. Wrapped and packed apples are confined mostly to Willamette and yellow Newtowns, with a few supplies of Reddolls, Arkansas blacks, and other varieties. Portland market is about depleted.

Apples of the same grade that sold at 25c to 30c in California is selling to Portland retailers at 20c—obviously an unprofitable margin.

Portuguese cherries from Pineda, California, which were Portland prices \$1.25 per 25-lb. box of culls, are now selling to retailers at \$1.25 per box. Another lot of the very poorest margin apples, which many producers are being distributed.
