The Myrtle Creek high school basketball team, winners of the county B league championship, decided in Roseburg recently, made a very fine record for the season, losing only one game. The team lost to Riddle in a game played at Riddle, but won against that team on the Myrtle Creek floor and also in a game played at Roseburg. Myrtle Creek piled up 615 points during the season against 283 scored by their opponents.

After winning the championship, the Myrtle Creek boys played against Medford high school, winning 24 to 23 in a very hotly contested battle. At the same time the second team lost to the Medford junior high school 19 to 18.
