

DEFICIT FEARED BY HOOVER IF ALL BILLS ARE PASSED

(Associated Press Leased Wire) WASHINGTON, April 6.—President Hoover is looking forward to a slender surplus at the close of this and the next fiscal year if the most rigid economy is exercised...

At the current rate of expenditure, the president said in a statement issued for publication today, "it appears that we should be able to close the fiscal year ending the thirtieth of next June with a very moderate surplus."

The same holds true for next year, he continued, but there the situation is clouded by the fact that a surplus originally estimated at \$47,000,000 has already been reduced by \$30,000,000 through congressional appropriations.

ANARCHIST FLEES IN N. Y. RIOT THAT BRINGS ONE DEATH

(Associated Press Leased Wire) NEW YORK, April 7.—An Italian anarchist, wanted for deportation, was sought today after he escaped under cover of a fight in which one man was killed and a detective was beaten at an anti-fascist meeting.

Armando Borghi, the anarchist, had finished a speech at the meeting in Cooper Union auditorium yesterday when Vincent Peangia, an immigration inspector, walked on the stage with a deportation warrant for him.

Shouting, "Stop, the police," Borghi fled while sympathizers in the audience swarmed about Peangia. Detective Thomas Lillenthal, who was in the back of the hall went to Peangia's aid. He was knocked down and kicked and beaten. Regaining his feet he drew his pistol and fired one shot, killing an unidentified man.

BISHOP REACHES 105TH BIRTHDAY

(Associated Press Leased Wire) SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., April 6.—Bishop E. Leodi Ahmed Mazzalanananda, born in Ispahan, Persia, 105 years ago, quietly celebrated his birthday here yesterday.

"I'm not good enough to go to heaven," the bishop said, "and I'm not old enough to go to hell, so I guess I'm destined to spend a good many years more on this earth."

Bishop Mazzalanananda, the only son of a Persian prince, is associated with the American Buddhist church of Dharma. He was ordained a priest after 16 years in the Buddhist monastery at L'Hassa, Tibet, and later took degrees from Oxford, Heidelberg and Paris.

GEN. GEO. A. WHITE NAMES TWO AIDES

SALEM, Ore., April 5.—Captain George L. Dutton and Lieutenant Thomas A. Davis of Portland were appointed yesterday as aides-de-camp in the 1st division by General George A. White, commander of the division. He said a third aide would be selected from Section 1.

Captain Dutton has been with the Oregon national guard six years. He was with the 1st division in France and was promoted for gallantry. He is an Oregon state college graduate, well known in the northwest as a football player and went to Portland from La-Grande.

Lieutenant Davis is a Reed college graduate and is now studying at the University of Oregon medical college in Portland. He has been with the Oregon national guard since 1923, and was aide-de-camp to General White when White commanded the 52nd infantry brigade.
