"The royal commission on transport, of which Sir Arthur Griffith-Boscawen is chairman, heard the testimony in the house of lords on speed limitation and safety by Maj. H. E. Chapman, on behalf of the 'Club' committee. The consensus of opinion of 45 club car-

stables of England, and Major Chapman is that insufficient penalties are now imposed by magistrates as a deterrent in cases of dangerous driving.

"Evidence on behalf of the commissioner of the metropolitan police was given by Herbert Tripp, who pointed out that there were 27 accidents in London in 1928 and during the same period there were 1927 fatalities as a result of street accidents.
