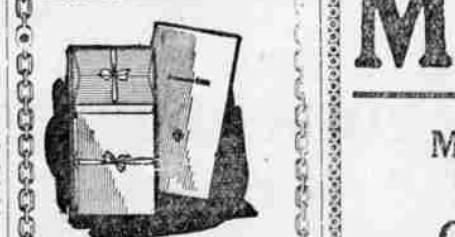

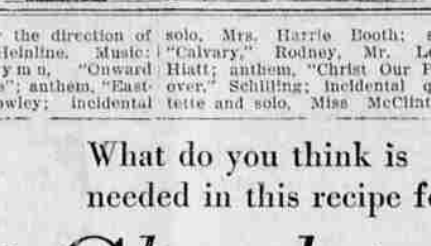

## After the Brawl Is Over

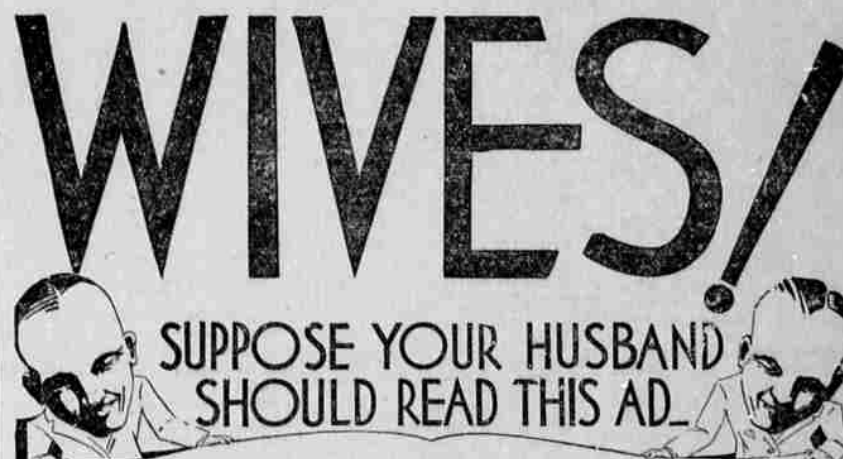
